The waiting is nearly over! After a lengthy period where Havering Parks Service, along with Chris Blandford Associates, have been progressing the procurement of a main contractor to carry out the restoration works, we can reveal that a main contractor has now been appointed. The winning tender was within the available budget, meaning that all of the planned and agreed elements of the restoration can take place. These include the construction of the new play area kiosk/toilets, the restoration and extension of the park keepers lodge, refurbishment of all footpaths throughout the park, enhanced entrances and redecoration of gates and railings, tree planting and significant shrub and herbaceous planting, repair of the lakeside promenade and new marginal planting, new bins, benches, entrance and interpretive signage, restoration of the bandstand, black shelter and summer theatre and so on. The Friends group will be liaising with LBH and the appointed contractor to develop a detailed works programme which commencement is expected to last around 42 weeks. The council will ensure that the works have the minimum impact on visitors to the park including the regular events and activities programme. Finally thanks for being so patient during the planning period. We all look forward to works commencing and especially to the completion of the programme ensuring that Raphael Park once again becomes the jewel in the crown of Havering's parks and open spaces.

LODGE FARM PARK A BLOOMING WINNER

We are pleased to report that Lodge Farm Park received a Siler Gilt medal, in the annual Park of the Year award. The Awards were held at Pembroke Lodge, Richmond Park on the 18th September after a busy summer of judging. MORE NEWS....

BAT SPECIES YOU MIGHT SEE IN RAPHAEL PARK

The best viewing time is 1/2 hour before dusk and up to 1 hour after dark.

Pipistrelle Bat is by far the most common species throughout the U.K. it has a wingstan of 19-25cm's. A healthy adult can weight-in, at a mere 6gms making them our smallest Bat.



Daubenton's Bat or water bat, is mainly associated with and around Lakes and Large ponds. They are a medium sized bat with a wingspan of 24 -27cm and weight-in between 7-12gms.

BAT WATCH

A still moonlight evening, in Raphael Park. Well wrapped up figures holding small clicking boxes lurking silently among the trees. What's happening? The object of the exercise was to observe bats and hopefully identify their roosting sites. Members of Essex Wildlife Trust were present as were Friends and Geoff Pepper from Parks Department. Bats are a protected species and knowing just where they are and how many there are is information that can help in their conservation. The information may be helpful but its' collection elicited curious stares from other park users.

Fortunately, all went off peacefully and we can report that the bat detectors buzzed throughout, thankfully with no roosting activity in areas of concern. This initial survey will be followed by with a deeper ecological survey of three particular trees. Our findings will be passed on to the Green City Bat Conservation Trust (which we are Members of).
